I was born and raised in Jenin City in Palestine. Since coming into this world, I have witnessed a great deal of darkness. Unfortunately, the occupation is ingrained in my DNA; you feel it around your head, your neck, every moment while at home, and it has left scars despite my departure. In 2002, during the brutal invasion of the West Bank, I didn't believe we would survive. Thankfully, I am still here. Since that invasion, pursuing an acting profession has become an essential way to amplify my people's voices. Theatre and art feel like the only means through which I can truly express the plight of my people and our situation.

This apartheid, this occupation, persists. Over the last ten months, we have witnessed a genocide in Gaza. Families fleeing their homes, massive and brutal bombings of civilian houses, schools, hospitals—children running through the streets

searching for their parents. My people are being exterminated, and we can only watch helplessly from our devices as the government remains complicit or indifferent. It shatters my heart into a billion pieces.

And so, we present the Free Palestine International Film Festival—an urgent initiative to showcase our creativity, humanity, and resilience to the world. We aim to amplify diverse voices from Palestine and beyond, sharing knowledge and spreading the truth. We want to prove that we are not mere numbers; we have names, dreams, goals, and a love for life despite all we endure. As Rafeef Ziadah eloquently put it, "We Palestinians wake up every morning to teach the rest of the world life, sir."

Welcome to the inaugural year of the Free Palestine International Film Festival. We've curated a selection of 21 films that center on Palestine in their unique ways. This festival emerges at a critical time—a time to discuss freedom and the urgent need to liberate Palestine and its people. 


